

Israell Helmes Deposition: Israell Helme being required to declare what hee knowes, conscerning y^e Bargaine betweene y^e say^d Armgard Prince, & y^e Plaint^s flather for Tynnacu Island & p^rmisses, Deposeth That Lagranges flather was to give y^{\circ} say^d Armgard for y^{\circ} same six Thousand Dutch Guilders, & y^t hee knowes there was three Hundred Dutch Guilders thereof p^d but knowes of y^e paym^t of noe more; And further sayt^h that y^e Three thousand Guild^rs (which is Three Hundred pounds) was to bee paid in this Countrey by agreem^t betweene Jacob Swanson & y^e flather of y^e Plain^t & further sayth that when the Plaint^s flather dyed hee y^e say^d Plain^t was a litle Child; and further sayth not.

ffop Johnsons Deposition: ffop Johnson being required to declare what hee knowes in y^e p^rmisses, Deposeth, That hee y^e said ffop, & y^e above menconed Israell, was desired by M^rs Armgard Prince als Popinjay to demand y^e remaind^r of y^e sayd Six Thousand Guild^rs which was Three Hundred pounds of M^rs Delagrange (y^e Plain^{ts} mother) And y^t shee y^e said M^{rs} Delagrange (upon y^e same demand) sayd shee could not pay it, & further sayth not.

Owing to the varied nationalities of the Swedish, Dutch, English and Welsh settlers in Pennsylvania, together with the general illiteracy of the time, much diversity in the spelling of names will be found in the early court records. Aside from the fact that with some the father's first name became the surname of the children we find that Orion became Archer, and the descendants of Neales Lawson took the name of Friend. Few would recognize the name of Mendenhall in Mynar or Minall. Some attempt has been made to represent the later accepted forms in this index.
